*Little Red Riding Hood is a fairy tale that originates from France. This script is suitable for 4 – 6 actors. Props include a basket and some food. Costume includes a red cloak and Grandmother's clothes for the Wolf to dress in.*

**NARRATOR 1** One day, Little Red Riding Hood's mother said to her

**MOTHER** Take this basket of goodies to your grandmother's cottage, but don't talk to any strangers on the way!

**NARRATOR 2** Promising not to, Little Red Riding Hood skipped off. On her way she met the Big Bad Wolf.

**WOLF** Where are you going little girl? Little

**LITTLE RED RIDING HOOD** To my grandmother's, Mr. Wolf!

**NARRATOR 1** The Big Bad Wolf then ran to her grandmother's cottage much before Little Red Riding Hood, and knocked on her door.

**NARRATOR 2** When Grandma opened the door, he locked her up in the cupboard. The wicked wolf then wore Grandma's clothes and lay on her bed, waiting for Little Red Riding Hood.

**NARRATOR 1** When Little Red Riding Hood reached the cottage, she entered and went to Grandma's bedside.

**LITTLE RED RIDING HOOD** My! What big eyes you have, Grandma!

**WOLF** All the better to see you with, my dear!

**LITTLE RED RIDING HOOD** My! What big ears you have, Grandma!

**WOLF** All the better to hear you with, my dear!

**LITTLE RED RIDING HOOD** What big teeth you have, Grandma!”

**WOLF** All the better to eat you with!

**NARRATOR 2** Little Red Riding Hood screamed and the woodcutters in the forest came running to the cottage.

**NARRATOR 1** They beat the Big Bad Wolf and rescued Grandma from the cupboard. Grandma hugged Little Red Riding Hood with joy.

**NARRATOR 2** The Big Bad Wolf ran away never to be seen again. Little Red Riding Hood had learnt her lesson and never spoke to strangers ever again.
